Governors are the strategic leaders of our schools and have a vital role to play in making sure every child gets the best possible education” (The Governors Handbook).

The Role of a School Governor

A School governing body has a strategic role in the development of the school but does not become involved in the day-to-day management issues – that is the role of the Head teacher.

Governing bodies should have a strong focus on three core strategies:

- ensure clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- holding the Head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils;
- over -seeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

School governors are drawn from different parts of the community such as parents, staff, the Local Authority, the community and other groups. This helps to ensure that the Governing Body has sufficient diversity of views and experience.

The Governing Body meets as a full body 4 times a year.

The following committees meet then report to the full Governing Body.

- The Strategic Leadership.
- Leadership and management including outcomes for pupils
- Quality of teaching and learning and assessment including personal development,behaviour and welfare.
- Personnel.
- Finance and premises.



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
